

Ireland Writing Retreat, based in Donegal, has launched the Wild Atlantic Writing Awards', including travel and food writing, with almost 3,000 euro worth of prizes.

The Retreat, which has been listed among the Top Ten artistic retreats of any kind in Europe by The Guardian newspaper, hosts week-long retreats several times a year in Donegal, Paris and along the Black Sea in Romania.

It has attracted participants, tutors and authors from countries as diverse as New Zealand, Sweden, Canada, France, Iceland, the US, Australia and the UK. The Wild Atlantic Writing Awards' are seen as providing an interesting challenge for journalists and others who have no choice but to stay at home for the next few weeks due to the coronavirus outbreak.

Creative nonfiction

For a creative nonfiction award,' participants must write a feature of not more than 500 words on any subject with travel or food writing welcome.

Flash fiction

The flash fiction category is open to all genres with a similar 500 word limit.

The winning entries will receive 500 euro in cash, plus 990 euro in the form of free participation to one of our retreats, including all daily excursions.

Riviera Nayarit





Riviera Nayarit, located on Mexico's Pacific coast is an excellent autumn/winter destination.

The region is part of the State of Nayarit in Mexico, just north of Puerto Vallarta International Airport.

The annual Miss Pacific Islands pageant



The annual Miss Pacific Islands pageant is still pencilled in for Samoa this November, following the win of Miss Samoa, Fonoifafo Nancy McFarland (below), Miss Samoa, in 2019.



Miss Samoa and Miss Pacific Islands pageants have been a part of Samoa's vibrant culture and traditions for over 30 years.

Taking place in Apia each September, the Miss Samoa is dedicated to supporting opportunities for young Samoan women.

The winner also works as a national ambassador for the islands during her year of reign.

The winner of Miss Samoa goes on to compete at the Miss Pacific Islands pageant, which serves as a platform to promote the entire Pacific Islands region.

Each year, representatives from up to 12 Pacific Islands compete in the Miss Pacific Islands pageant. Last year's contestants were from American Samoa, the Cook Islands, Fiji, the Marshall Islands, Nauru, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, the Solomon Islands, Tahiti, Tonga, Tuvalu, and Wallis & Futuna.

This year's festivities are set to coincide with the celebration of 30 years of the Teuila Festival, Samoa's biggest annual event showcasing the best of the country's music, dance, food, and craft.



A reason to write about

Lepogo Lodges at Noka Camp South Africa







Lepogo Lodges' Noka Camp, which is one of Africa's few entirely not-for-profit safari lodges, is adding to its eco-credentials by working with local and global charity organisations to offset their guests' carbon footprint.

Lepogo Lodges calculates the carbon emissions resulting from each guest's journey, from the time they leave their home to the moment they return.

The figure is converted into a monetary value which is then donated by Lepogo

Lodges into one of three conservation projects chosen by the guest.

Community Stove Project – A community outreach programme

Lepogo Lodges works with the Lapalala Wilderness School's Outreach Programme to launch the Community Stove Project.

This sees high efficiency stoves donated to the local community, to help the environment and improve health.

The new stoves reduce the wood used in each household by an estimated 2.5 tons per year and during a stove's estimated fiveyear life span, its usage will save 30 trees and 12 tonnes of CO2.

South Africa Forest Trust – A biodiversity enhancement programme

The South African Reforestation Trust is a not-for-profit organisation and platform bringing landowners, institutions, companies and individuals together to plant and extend indigenous forest eco-systems.

The trust works with four forest sites which require rehabilitative intervention – the Overberg, Grootvadersbosch Conservancy near Swellendam, Wilderness and the Boland.

Stand for Trees – A global programme

Stand for Trees aims to protect the world's most spectacular forest landscapes, surrounding communities and inhabiting wildlife and runs 16 conservation projects across Northern Zimbabwe, Kenya, Tanzania, Sierra Leone, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia, Peru and Brazil.

Other initiatives

Lepogo Lodges also supports local communities by helping them start businesses, which supply products for the lodge and on-site curio shop.

The property is also supporting the conservation of cheetah and is working with Lapalala to establish the reserve as a centre of excellence for the release of wild cheetah.

Lepogo Lodges' Noka Camp

The camp lies within the 50,000-hectare, malaria-free, 'big five', Lapalala Wilderness Reserve and consists of five stilted villas, which are joined by a main lodge, all atop a 100ft cliff overlooking the winding Palala River below and the endless bush ahead.

The camp is entirely off-grid, with all energy self-generated by a 250m solar walkway.

Verbier, with Val de Bagnes and La Tzoumaz, is located at 1,500m in the Val de Bagnes on south-facing plateau and views of the Massif des Combins.



The winter sports region extends from Le Châble at 850m up to Mont-Fort at 3,330m and, between November to April, 410km of slopes of varying levels and off-piste trails make Verbier 4 Vallées the largest ski area in Switzerland.

The Mountains of Romania by Janneke Klop, which is a new guidebook by Cicerone, describes 27 short treks in the Romanian mountains.



Romania is a southeastern European country known for the forested region of Transylvania, ringed by the Carpathian Mountains.

Its preserved medieval towns include Sighişoara, and there are many fortified churches and castles, notably clifftop Bran Castle, long associated with the Dracula legend.

Also included is an ascent of Moldoveanu, Romania's highest peak at 2544m.

The routes showcase Romania's stunning, diverse landscapes and offer an insight into the country's rich history and traditional rural life.

Some routes take advantage of the network of mountain huts and others the chance to camp in wild locations.

The graded routes, mostly on waymarked trails, take in rolling hills, craggy karst peaks, glacial lakes and Europe's last virgin forests, with other highlights including Transylvanian castles, wooden churches and the Sapte Scari (Seven Ladders) and Turda Gorges.

Historic towns such as the medieval Saxon towns of Brasov and Sibiu and the spa resort of

Vatra Dornei offer easy access to the mountains; other routes visit remote villages that have changed little over the centuries, and where self-sufficiency is still very much the way of life.

Bulletin box : Spring time in the Celtic Routes









The Celtic Routes takes in Pembrokeshire, Ceredigion and Carmarthenshire, Wales and Wicklow, Waterford and Wexford, Ireland.

Every spring the Routes offer verdant meadows, rolling hillsides, leafy woodlands, dense forests, landscaped gardens and grassy river banks.

Locations include :

Mount Congreve, Waterford

Ambrose Congreve won 13 Gold Medals at the Chelsea Flower Show for his gardens.

Today they comprise around 70 acres of intensively-planted woodland, a 4-acre walled garden and 16km of walkways.

The entire collection consists of over 3,000 different trees and shrubs, including 2,000 Rhododendrons, 600 Camellias, 300 Acer cultivars and 600 conifers with many more tender species contained in the Georgian glasshouse.

Wells House & Gardens, Wexford

Wells House & Gardens was originally created in the late 17th century, and in the 1830s, the English architect Daniel Robertson redesign the house and gardens as it looks today.

Llandeilo and the Tywi Valley, Carmarthenshire

The market town of Llandeilo, with its narrow streets and painted Georgian houses has, in the surrounding Tywi Valley, some of the finest scenery in Wales.

Perched on a 90-metre limestone crag, Carreg Cennen dominates the skyline for miles. Dryslwyn Castle sits on a rocky hill and the Elizabethan gardens of Aberglasney and the National Botanic Garden are nearby along with National Trust properties including the Neo-Gothic Paxton's Tower.

Minwear Woods, Pembrokeshire

Minwear Woods is a Site of Specific Scientific Interest (SSSI) in the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park, near Narberth. Located close to the Cleddau Estuary, the combination of salt and fresh water provides a varied habitat for wildlife, with waterside birds like herons and kingfishers along with the great spotted woodpeckers and tree creepers.

The woodland also sustains a wide range of flora and, in spring, the woodland paths come alive with bright yellow lesser celandine and bluebells

Waterford Greenway, Waterford

The former Waterford City to Dungarvan railway line has been transformed into a 46km off-road cycling and walking trail, taking in 11 bridges, three viaducts and a 400 metre-long tunnel.

There's also the 9th century Woodstown Viking settlement, the ornamental gardens at Mount Congreve and the Waterford & Suir Valley Heritage Railway.

The area also has the River Suir, Comeragh Mountains, the Copper Coast and Dungarvan Bay.

Pumlumon, Ceredigion

Pumlumon, meaning 'Five Peaks', is a ridge of peaks in the Cambrian Mountains, with the highest the 752m Pen Pumlumon Fawr.



To the west, Snowdonia links to Preseli via the sweep of Cardigan Bay and, to the east, the Berwyn and Aran ranges connect to the Brecon Beacons along the English border.

Courtown Woodland Walks, Wexford

Although mainly a seaside village, the 60acre wood in Courtown provides a source of shade from the nearby beach.

During the 1860s and 70s, James Stopford, the 5th Earl of Courtown, established a pinetum in the grounds of Courtown House.

Trees remaining from his collection include a Californian redwood, swamp cypress, Japanese cedar, a cedar of Lebanon and numerous pines, yews and true cypresses.

Glendalough and Upper Lake, Wicklow

Carved out by glaciers during the last Ice Age, Glendalough or Gleann dá Loch, means 'Valley of the Two Lakes'.

- 1 pinch of salt
- 0,5 gr lemon juice

Ingredients for the Pineapple & Banana Mix

- 50 gr Banana
- 45 gr of Pineapple
- 50 ml Lime Juice
- 100 ml Pineapple juice

Blend all your ingredients, and let it settle down over night so the saffron strings can provide that really rich colour. After that strain it out!


